Partnership between the Tunisian Internet Agency & Meninx Technologies

The Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI) & Meninx Technologies Data Center (MXT) announce a public-private partnership which covers:

-- The strengthening and active participation in the deployment in Tunisia of the Internet Protocol in its version 6 (commonly called IPv6). Indeed, the ATI as an Internet exchange point for Tunisia(TunIXP) and Meninx Technologies, as designer and operator of the First Private Data Center, will work to ensure better IPv6 addressing of Tunisian sites which will be hosted in the new Meninx Data Center located in Enfidha.

-- The membership of MXT - identified by AS 37504 assigned by Afrinic www.afrinic.net - as a new member of the Tunisian internet traffic exchange platform – TunIXP of ATI.

-- Hosting at Meninx Data Center a secondary copy of the Tunisian DNS in order to improve the offer of secure hosting of applications and websites in Tunisia with guaranteed performance and high availability. ATI and Meninx Data Center have the ambition, through this partnership, to make Tunisiaa crossroads for exchanges between operators, Cloud players and information and communication technology players in general.

Tunis, February 22, 2012

Following the appeal to the Court of Cassation in case no. 2011/99325 dated May 26, 2011 relating to the filtering of pornographic sites, the Court's decision was made public today in favor of the Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI), thus accepting the argument on the merits presented by our lawyers. Consequently, the case is referred back to the Tunis Court of Appeal.

The ATI would like to point out that to date, and since June 14, 2011, its technical services have only been able to apply the filtering of said sites listed by *Smartfilter*®, only for establishments and public community networks. As for the five Internet service providers, all attempts to apply the judgment resulted in serious deteriorations in the quality of service (fluidity of Internet traffic at the transit node).

Furthermore, the ATI would like to thank all those who have supported it since the revolution, and reiterates its determination to continue working for the development of the Internet in Tunisia, and to act as an IXP (Point of Internet Exchange), in a transparent and neutral manner towards everyone.

History of the case



- May 19, 2011: Three lawyers file a complaint against the ATI with the aim of censoring pornographic websites.
- May 26, 2011: the judge decides, in summary proceedings, to censor the porn sites and issues an execution order which is contested by the ATI, as much as the judgment.
- June 13, 2011: the judge refuses the appeal to stop execution of the judgment.
- June 14, 2011: ATI begins to apply filtering for its clients (public establishments).
- July 4, 2011: 1st session of the appeal > postponement to July 18.
- July 18, 2011: 2nd session of the call > postponement to August 4
- August 4, 2011: 3rd session of the appeal > pleadings of both parties (with new elements), the judge announces that he will render his decision on August 15.
- August 15, 2011: rejection of the appeal, the judge confirmed the order of censorship at the Court of First Instance, the ATI decides to appeal to cassation, the highest legal instance in Tunisia.
- February 1, 2012: The Court of Cassation postpones the judgment.
- February 15, 2012: The Court of Cassation postpones the judgment
- February 22, 2012: The Court of Cassation accepts the ATI's appeal, and sends the case back to the Court of Appeal.

Tunis, February 15, 2012

The court of **Cassation** postponed its decision in the case of **Censorship** pornographic sites.

Tunis, November 23, 2011

Following the disruptions that occurred on one of its hosting servers on November 22, 2011 from 3:30 p.m., the Tunisian Internet Agency expresses its deep regret to its customers, and announces that the necessary measures have been taken to remedy to this situation and so that such problems do not happen again from now on. ATI reminds that it always remains attentive to all its customers and that it will spare no effort to improve the quality of service of its services.

Tunis on October 12, 2011

The Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI) participates for the first time as Internet Traffic Exchange Point (IXP) of Tunisia, in the forum of the association of European IXPs ([Euro-IX](#)) including the 19th edition takes place in Lyon on October 17 and 18, 2011. The objective is for the ATI to become a member of this association which currently brings together 61 IXPs , including four in the Africa region. To do this, the ATI should comply with the best international practices adopted by the said association, particularly in terms of technical architecture of the infrastructure deployed, transparency, pricing and accounting for the costs of services.

Tunis October 7, 2011

The Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI) announces the launch of the first mirror server in the Middle East and Africa region dedicated to the Open Source Tor platform project: <http://tor.mirror.tn>

Tunis August 15, 2011

After refusing the request of the Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI) to suspend the execution of the summary judgment of the court of first instance of Tunis relating to case n°2011/99325 dated May 26, 2011 relating to the filtering of pornographic sites, the Tunis Court of Appeal handed down a judgment (case no. 5/24675) against the ATI.

In this regard, the ATI recalls that until today and since June 14, 2011, the filtering of the addresses of pornographic sites listed by Smartfilter® has not been possible for the five Internet service providers (Globalnet, Hexabyte, Orange Tunisia, Topnet and Tunet) without observing any deterioration in the quality of service (fluidity of Internet traffic) despite the many attempts and actions carried out in this direction.

While expressing its deep respect for these judgment decisions, the ATI announces that it will appeal them to the Court of Cassation.

Tunis July 5, 2011

In the context of summary proceedings no. 289/15 dated June 11, 2011 between the Banque Nationale des Gènes and the Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI), relating to the censorship of a Facebook page, the Court of first instance of Tunis ruled in favor of the ATI by rejecting the plaintiff's request.

Tunis June 21, 2011

As part of the execution of the summary judgment of the court of first instance of Tunis (case n°2011/99325 dated May 26, 2011), the Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI) proceeded,

today, filtering the addresses of pornographic sites listed by Smartfilter®, for public Internet centers (publinets), the network of youth centers, as well as the public community network managed by the CIMSP (Computer Center of the Ministry of Health Public).

Tunis, June 16, 2011

In accordance with its action plan established as part of the execution of the summary judgment of the court of first instance of Tunis (case no. 2011/99325 dated May 26, 2011), the Tunisian Internet Agency proceeded today to the implementation of filtering of pornographic site addresses listed by Smartfilter® for users of the public community network managed by the CCK (El-Khawarizmi Calculation Center).

Tunis June 15, 2011

as part of the execution of the summary judgment of the court of first instance of Tunis (case no. 2011/99325 dated May 26, 2011), the ATI implemented the filtering of the addresses of pornographic sites listed by Smartfilter®, for its public sector subscribers who are directly connected to its Internet network as well as for users of public community networks managed by IRESA (Institute of Agricultural Research and Higher Education).

NB: Given the technical constraints presented previously, the ATI does not assume responsibility if one or more sites deemed non-pornographic are filtered in error.

Tunis June 14, 2011

The Tunisian Internet Agency (ATI) expresses its deep respect for the decision of the judge of the court of appeal to refuse its request concerning the suspension of the summary judgment of the court of first instance of Tunis. This decision dated June 13, 2011 comes after 5 months from the date of the last speech of the deposed President ordering the opening of all websites in Tunisia.

The ATI technical teams are today beginning a plan to implement filtering equipment using a gradual approach to control aspects related to quality of service.

In this regard, it is important to remember that after the historic revolution of January 14, 2011, the ATI's filtering equipment was not updated and maintained as in previous years, which would possibly lead to problems. disruptions to the fluidity of Internet traffic in Tunisia.

Pending the judgment of the Court of Appeal, the first session of which is scheduled for July 4, 2011, the ATI reiterates its determination to act, as an Internet Exchange Point, in a transparent and neutral manner with regard to all sites to filter through its equipment.

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
